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## **Monday, 12 September: St Fagans Museum**

**To bring** Please bring black shoes (low heels for women) and black socks/stockings to wear as necessary under robes or costumes. Those with lay roles at Mass (see p. 5) may wish to bring other medieval-looking footwear.

**Arrival** Please arrive at the **museum entrance by 13.15** at the latest.  
Go to the main museum entrance.  
Keith Beasley and/or Judith Aveling will be there to meet you from 12.30.  
Make sure that one or other of them has checked you off the list!

**By car** We have **free car parking** passes for the week.  
Please collect one from the lodge at the entrance as you drive in.  
See p. 6 for directions to the museum.

**Luggage** If you are coming by train, we will arrange to store your luggage near the entrance in one of the cars. See p. 7 regarding travel from station to museum.

**First session** First session is in **St Teilo's Church at 13.30**  
Allow 8 minutes to walk from the museum entrance/car park.  
Pick up a museum map at the main entrance.  
Or use the map and directions on p. 6 of this document.

**Lunch** Just today, please get your own lunch before the first session. In the museum there is a café at the entrance, and a restaurant upstairs. There is also a bakery and the Gwalia Café further into the museum site on the way to the church.

### **Our working base: St Fagans Museum**

We shall be using two buildings: Oakdale Institute (upper floor, with WCs on the ground floor); St Teilo's Church. They are within 2 minutes' walk of one another, but about 8 minutes' walk from the museum entrance. Please allow time for getting to and fro. See the museum map and directions for reaching St Fagans.

You are provided with morning and afternoon coffee/tea; simple buffet lunch.  
Water will also be available – but bring a bottle of your own for the church.

### **Hotel**

Copthorne Millennium Hotel, Culverhouse Cross, Cardiff CF5 6DH

T: 029 2059 9100. This is just over a mile from the museum.

The hotel is just off the A48 on the St Nicholas side of Culverhouse intersection/roundabout.

Those who are resident are provided with room, breakfast and dinner at the hotel.

Non-residents are counted in for dinner

The hotel has fitness facilities, including a swimming pool and sauna.

Drinks at the bar are quite expensive. However, the hotel is in a retail park area, and both M&S and Tesco Extra are within 10 minutes' walk (just on the other side of the A48 road).

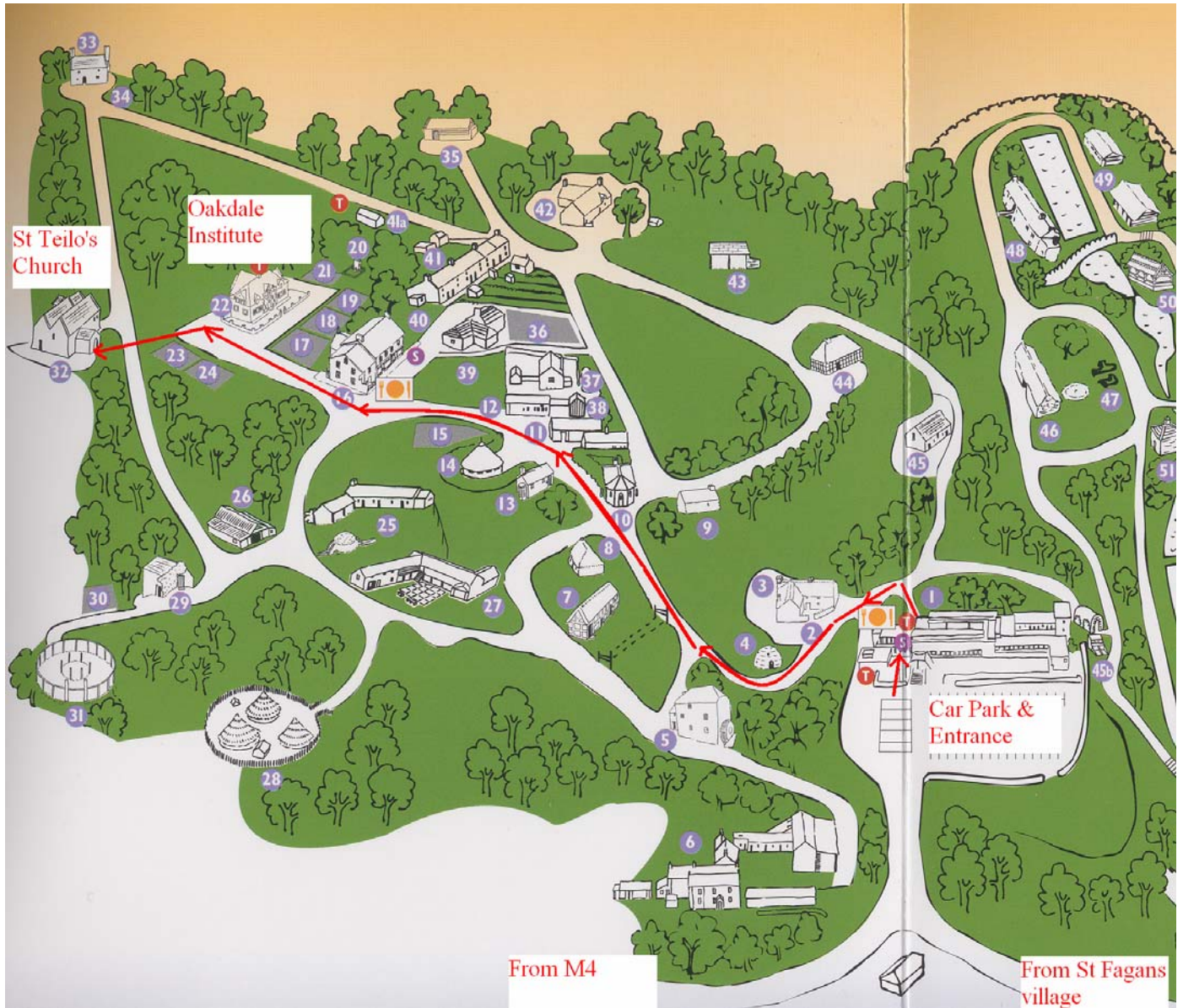

From the main entrance  
Go up the stairs, and through the conservatory-style doors at the top  
Then turn left  
Follow the path to the madder-pink farmhouse  
Go to the left of that through the farmyard  
Then take the path to the right  
Take the path to the left of the toll-house (then passing the bakery on your right)  
Keep straight on to the left of Gwalia stores  
And straight on to the left of Oakdale Institute (toilets available here)  
Follow the path into the trees, and you will see St Teilo's, painted white, in front of you.
